Strategies for Facilitating Development in Toddlers & Preschoolers

Working with these specialized populations showed the principles of IM therapy are effective even when maximum tactile assistance, positional modifications and individualized client reinforcements were required. This willingness to take IM "out-of-the-box" and the consistently amazing results lead to the development of a modified protocol to treat a 22 month old diagnosed with Agenesis of the Corpus Collosum. Ongoing treatment and study of this child has resulted in phenomenal gains in gross motor, fine motor and speech, astounding her parents as well as her PT and OT therapists.
